





“Exhibit B”

Fees that could have been charged, based on project Valuation of \$212,909.00 for Payson High School Challenge Course, if Project Valuation would have been used, is as follows:

- Plan Review: $\$1057.26 \times 2$ for starting construction prior to obtaining the required permit= **2114.52.**
- Permit Fee: $1,626.55 \times 2$ for same reason. =**3,253.10**
- Total Permit Fee that could have been charged based on Valuation, doubled because project was started prior to obtaining the permit: **Total that could have been charged \$5,367.02.**

Permit Fees that were charged based on actual time spent for review and inspection that were needed:

- Plan Review (3rd Party Structural Review billed to the Town by Floyd Swenson, Structural Engineer \$440 and \$100, for review time by Town Staff for this project) Total \$540
- Permit Fee based on actual inspections that the project demanded was \$300.
- Project fees were doubled as project was started without first receiving a Building Permit
- Total Fees charged are as follows:
 - $\$840 \times 2 = \$1,680$
