

## MESSAGE FROM THE TOWN MANAGER

We are very fortunate to have Town employees who are dedicated to serving our residents and committed to making Payson a great place to live, work, and play. If I had to use one word to describe our people, that word would be 'AWESOME'! In an effort to create an opportunity for these awesome employees to help our town be all it can be, I am pleased to announce the formation of an Employee Engagement Committee (EEC). The goal of the EEC is to improve communications, enhance employee engagement, and make better informed recommendations and choices. The committee will support employees by engaging in learning, sharing decision alternatives, and soliciting input on various topics from our colleagues and co-workers. Committee members will also serve as an important communication channel to assist others to understand new programs and changes. To name a few areas likely to be explored, the EEC may work on topics such as employee benefits, work place safety and wellness, and employee recognition/celebrations.


The committee will be administered by the Human Resources Department, on behalf of the Town Manager. To ensure a diverse range of perspectives, the goal is to create a committee comprised of employees from across departments, tenures, pay grades and roles. The committee will initially be limited to 12 members. The EEC will most likely meet once per month and could meet more frequently while working on specific projects, such as benefits. Members will serve for a one year term.

Chief Tischer and Lieutenant Hazelo presented at the March 16th Chamber of Commerce breakfast and luncheon.






## Design a patrol car contest

The fire department is continuing its Engineer Academy. The students are in the last stage of the training where they will be conducting field exercises.





The crew was on a medical call and when they walked out of the house they noticed a man lying in the snow by the mail boxes. They went to see what was wrong, took the man back into his house and began assessing him. The patient went into full cardiac arrest. The crew immediately began CPR and Advanced Cardiac Life support treatments on the patient. The man survived and came to the station a couple weeks later to thank the crew. Kudos to a job well done by our crew!

### **Community Center**

During the regular meeting of the Town Council on March 11, 2021, Town Council provided direction to the Parks & Recreation Commission to work with Town partners in engaging the community to gather public input and feedback regarding the possible construction of a community center development project.

With this direction, the Parks & Recreation Commission Board held a special meeting on Monday, March 15, 2021 to work with the Town partners in developing a survey to distribute broadly to the community to gather such feedback.

As a result, a survey was developed and distributed to the community on March 16, 2021.



### As of Monday, March 22, the survey had received a total of 616 responses.

#### **Vactor Truck**

The following photos are of the new Vactor Truck in its first day of operation by the Streets Maintenance Division. This was approved in the current fiscal year for lease/purchase, paid over the next four fiscal years. The life cycle should be about 25 years. The vehicle is used for flushing drainage pipes. This new vehicle has almost quadrupled our capability in the field to keep our drainage infrastructure flowing at design capacity.

## WATER DEPARTMENT

The Town of Payson Water Department would like to spread the word that renters and landlords in Gila County can apply for federally funded financial assistance with rent and utility bills through the AZ Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP).

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 authorized financial rent and utility relief for Arizona renters and landlords to be administered at the state and local level. Renters and landlords in Gila County are able to apply for ERAP assistance through the AZ Department of Economic Security. Applications will be accepted through the program's expiration on December 31, 2021 or until funding is exhausted.

Rental assistance is available to both landlords and renters. While both may apply for assistance, eligibility is based on the renter's address and ability to meet the following federal criteria:

- The renter has a risk of homelessness, housing instability, or unsafe living conditions demonstrated by the following:
  - Eviction notice
  - Utility shutoff notice
  - Past due rent notice
  - Past due utility notice
  - Any other evidence of unsafe or unhealthy living conditions or housing instability
- The renter or member of the renter's household is eligible for unemployment insurance benefits or has experienced a financial hardship as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic
- The renter's household income is less than or equal to 80% of the Area Median Income (AMI)

Applicants are encouraged to apply safely and conveniently from their own homes using the ERAP online portal at era.azdes.gov. Applicants unable to apply online may apply by phone via the ERAP hotline at 1-833-912-0878.

During their application, renters will need to provide a copy of lease/rental agreement, photo ID, electricity and/or gas bill, disconnection notice (if any), proof of income, eviction notice (if applicable) and proof of hardship, such as a termination letter.

The Town of Payson Water Department is sharing this information by both email and our automated call system this month with account holders who are at a past due status of 60-days or more. We included a note on our bill cards sent out at the end of February and will do so again this month. Postings to the Town website and Facebook page have been made as well. Please help us get the word out to anyone who may be in need of this resource.
