We had a children's area with a petting zoo, toy drawing, and free balsa gliders. There were over 20 aircraft on display.


Many thanks to the Payson Pilots Association, the Experimental Aircraft Association, the Payson Aero Club, and the 99s.

WATER DEPARTMENT

Hooray, Hooray! The Town of Payson now owns the 7 acres of land under the C.C. Cragin Project Water Treatment Plant.

The Water Department has been actively pursuing the purchase of that land for many years and on September 29th the closing documents were recorded with Gila County for a purchase price of \$155,000. Previously, the operations of the Treatment Plant were under a special use permit from the United States Forest Service. Meanwhile, appraisals were completed and the federal processing was done to purchase the land under the auspices of the United States Town-site Act of 1958 and amended in 1976.
