The Town of Payson applied for the Build Back Better Regional Grant. We are one of 529 applicants and 50-60 are expected to be funded. Our application was focused on critical economic infrastructure for the area.

Parks Operations Updates:

 Park staff placed 60 flags along Main Street/ Country Club Dr. and Green Valley Parkway for the Veterans Day Ceremony.

We want to recognize our part-time maintenance staff for their hard work and assistance. Some of their most recent accomplishments include:

Our new ADA accessible Bocce court is nearing completion and a first "throw" event is being coordinated in the upcoming weeks.



WATER DEPARTMENT

On November 1, 2021 the Town of Payson received Arizona Department of Environmental Quality(ADEQ) approval of construction for a new water booster station that will provide new fire protection on the southwest corner of Town. Specifically, this booster station includes 5 new booster pumps capable of supplying domestic demands and fire flow protection for the homes in the new Green Valley Vista subdivision and along the existing S. Gold Nugget Lane.

This new booster station is also equipped with a state of the art Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) monitoring system and an emergency backup electrical generator. The booster station was constructed in cooperation with Whelan Custom Homes LLC and is certainly a benefit to the Town of Payson. Now that the booster station can provide necessary flows, the Town of Payson Water Department will begin installing new fire hydrants along the existing S. Gold Nugget Lane.


