Chair Bollier opened public comments. Several citizens voiced their concerns regarding the baseball field usage, the condition of the pickleball courts, and the Parks and Recreation fee schedule.

3. Unfinished Business

- a) Discussion regarding the below actions that were presented to users and discuss any modifications.
 - 1. Implement locking of baseball field gates/requiring reservations from March July annually, and as needed during other heavy use periods and weather. One field such as (R1) to remain available for open play when not reserved for use (weather or other restrictions may override). (note: keep Multipurpose fields open for use all year around)
 - 2. Re-confirm locking of gates (with use of signage) when fields have been prepped for games, maintenance, and weather (e.g., too wet from rain/snow), etc.
 - 3. Update language to Chapter 93 ordinance to: Work with Police to add enforcement for violations with fees and increasing penalties for misuse of town assets and provide Town better tools for enforcement. Include other updates as needed to assist the Town in managing Parks programs and facilities.
 - 4. Offer up to 6 timeslots for Tournaments annually based on dates available as determined by the Town and approval process.
 - 5. Develop wildlife/pest management plan.
 - 6. Evaluate fee structure: consider different rates for different fields, verify if deposit requirements sufficient, consider creating a capital replacement fee, etc.
 - 7. Additional input or direction regarding staff actions and discussions that are underway regarding field use and policies.

Motion: Town staff to clarify recommendations based on community feedback. Moved by Member Thompson, seconded by Member Foote-Blaine. Motion passed by group consensus.
