The Town of Payson recently launched the annual Fiscal Year 2023/2024 Capital Improvement Community Survey on January 5, 2023. This is the fourth year the Town has released this specific survey, and we want to encourage residents to provide their input in this important data gathering tool. In last year's survey, the participation increased with a total of 548 responses. We're striving to continue the increase of citizen responses each year. We have advertised the survey on our website, social media, radio, and in the local newspaper.

The Payson Town Council encourages residents to engage in their local government and provide input to the future planning of Payson, by completing the Capital Improvement Survey. Over the past several years the council has utilized the information gained from community members to develop a list of priority capital projects. They use these priorities by directing resources toward the planning and design of projects which are the most important needs and desires of the community. Your voice in this process is critical to the future of Payson.



Splash Pad Project Update

In the previous update staff shared they had been notified that the review processes for the archeological monitoring plan had been completed and approved by the State Historic Preservation Office and the Tohono O'odham Nation. On December 6th, the Town received notification from AZ State Parks & Trails that the Archeological Monitoring Plan has now also been completed and approved by the National Parks Service. The Town has not been allowed to perform any work on the site until this approval was received. The Town is now cleared to move forward with the project. On Wednesday, January 11th Western Technologies (geotechnical), AZTEC Engineering Group (archeologist) and Parks Operations staff will be doing inventory and analysis for the engineering survey of the splashpad site in Rumsey Park.

This survey requires coordination with the surveyor and the archeological team as both need to be present during the time of initial excavation work. The survey collects information about subsurface conditions and is needed to complete design documents and firm up project costs. In the meantime, staff is continuing to work on project specifications to prepare for purchasing equipment and installation services. These contracted services are expected to be brought to Council for approval in the 1st quarter of 2023.





Fall Soccer League Champion Hoodies were donated by Banner Health Payson Medical Center! Thank you for making our youth sport leagues special!








FIRE DEPARTMENT

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Welcome Commander Josh Haines



Commander Joshua Haines started with the Payson Police Department in December. He comes to us from Scottsdale PD. During his time in Scottsdale, he worked full-time as a patrol officer, school resource officer, patrol sergeant, school resource unit supervisor, and lieutenant. Josh has training in responding to mental health related issues, being crisis intervention trained (CIT) and a graduate of the FBI's crisis negation school (CNT). He also worked in temporary assignments with the street crimes unit, gang enforcement unit, intelligence unit, burglary unit, bike unit, and DPS GIITEM. He was a member of the rapid response team and managed the department's driving program. When he left the Scottsdale Police Department, he was serving as a patrol watch commander. Josh graduated from NAU with a bachelor's degree in psychology and political science and has a master's degree in organizational leadership in criminal justice administration.

Prior to working as a police officer, Josh worked with the US Forest Service (Kaibab and Coconino National Forests) for 8 years as a firefighter. In that role he worked on a type 3 engine as a firefighter, on a type 3 helicopter as a firefighter, worked as fire prevention officer, and worked for one year as an engineer on a type 3 engine and one year as a captain on a type 2 water tender.

Josh grew up in Williams. He has been married to Jamie for 14 years, and they have two boys, Wyatt and Cody. He loves being outdoors running, hiking, hunting, fishing, camping, and reading. The family is excited to be in Payson and they look forward to becoming a part of this community!
