PAYSON LIBRARY

It is pretty clear that the Payson Public Library (along with most public libraries in the Country) is continuing to evolve from traditional book & reference based services towards a more vibrant community hub where people meet, interact, enrich their lives through varied educational and/or entertaining programs, and make use of our connectivity.

The increased program attendance numbers at the Payson Public Library can be chalked up to a few things. The library had a full-time and fully qualified children's librarian for the entire fiscal year (Sianee really is a dynamo)! The library has partnered with local groups to offer additional adult programs to the public (Line Dancing, for instance) and find that some of our most heavily attended programs are those that welcome seniors. As COVID fears ebb, people are no longer as concerned about congregating in larger groups. I think the days of quiet and studious public libraries are behind us!



Payson Library State statistical report for the 2022/2023 Fiscal Year

- The door counter clocked 74,140 visits to the library (up from 55,465)
- Staff answered 10,389 questions at the reference desk (up from 8,591). This includes computer help/assistance with job applications & government forms, reference, and reader's advisory.
- Members of the public logged onto library computers 8,125 times (up from 7,181).
- The library wireless was accessed by the public 27,650 times (up from 23,400).
- Total Circulation was 103,910 (up from 99,608).
- Use of eBooks and eAudio by Payson patrons was 10,179 (a number that has more than doubled over 2 years).
- Staff ran 436 programs with a total attendance/audience of 7,116! (Last year we ran 433 programs, but total attendance was only 3,121).



Remodeled Public Safety Communications Center at the Payson Police Department

Thanks to funding provided by the State, we were able to restructure the floorplan of our Public Safety Communications Center. Our Communication Center is currently allotted for four workstations. This new floor plan project creates space for an additional workstation for a dispatch trainer or supervisor. This reorganization also allows for better workflow between the dispatchers on the floor, making it easier for them to communicate with each other, while also communicating with first responders and the public. We are currently staffed with 14 dispatchers, with up to four dispatchers working at one time.

Below are pictures of the remodel in progress. As you can see, there was significant amount of electrical rewiring necessary and very limited space. A big thank you to our IT Department for their hard work along with Commander Jason Hazelo who oversaw this enormous undertaking.




WATER DEPARTMENT

On the week of December 11th the Water Dept. began the work of shutting down the C.C. Cragin project for the 2023 operating year. Through dilligent planning and a lot of team effort, the Water Dept. switched from Cragin water back to groundwater on December 15, 2023. Groundwater will continue being delivered to customers through April 2024. Once again the Water Dept. staff did a great job managing and delivering the Cragin water from May to mid December this year. Hats off to the staff who work hard to make sure high quality water is available to the the Town of Payson residents.

This was the 5th operational year running the Cragin project. The Town treated and delivered a total of 1,830 acre-feet (606 million gallons) of Cragin water this year. Of this volume, about 500 acre-feet (163 million gallons) of Cragin water was injected back into the aquifer to replenish groundwater levels in Payson.

The Cragin project has enabled Payson to be one of the only communities in Arizona to have a surplus of water resources. Groundwater levels throughout town are rising to their historic, pre-development levels, which is a rare accomplishment in the desert southwest. This groundwater replenishment effort will help offset water demands in future years when drought effects water storage levels at the C.C. Cragin reservoir.

Town Council Elections

August 6, 2024 is the date for the Town of Payson Election for the following purposes:

- ·To elect a Mayor to serve a two year term
- ·To elect <u>one</u> Council Member to serve a two-year term and to elect <u>three</u> Council Members to serve four-year terms
- Adopt the 2024 General Plan update
- ·To vote on any other legally qualified ballot measures

Any Town of Payson resident interested in running for any office must file a Statement of Interest form with the Town Clerk, prior to obtaining signatures on nomination petitions. You may pick the form up from the Town Clerk's Office, located at Town Hall, 303 N. Beeline Highway, and file it with the Town Clerk.

The Town provides interested candidates with a packet, which contains information describing the requirements to become a candidate for the election. Candidate packets were available in the Town Clerk's Office beginning January 5, 2024. The filing deadline for nomination petitions is 5:00 p.m. on April 8, 2024.

The Town of Payson Election will be conducted by the Gila County Election Department, per the Consolidated Elections law passed in 2012, by the Arizona State Legislature, which require all National, State, County, School, Special District and Local Elections to be placed on one ballot.


