
Replaced 6 AC Units between Town Hall, the IT Building, and the Library. Some units were 20 years old!



MADD Recognizes Arizona Officers

On June 28, 2024, Officer Buzzard was invited to the Annual Law Enforcement recognition ceremony (LER) sponsored by MADD which was held at the Wild Horse Pass Conference Center. The ceremony recognizes officers throughout the state that go above and beyond when it relates to DUI enforcement activities. During the conference, Officer Buzzard was presented with the MADD Hero award.

Throughout the past year, Officer Buzzard had over double the arrests that typically occur with DUI enforcement. He achieved these outstanding proactive enforcement efforts while still fulfilling his regular patrol duties. He also continued his career progression in DUI enforcement by obtaining phlebotomy certification. With this certification, he has not only assisted our agency but other agencies with blood draws which at times requires being called out when he is not working.

DUI enforcement typically is a very complicated area of law enforcement to which Officer Buzzard has dedicated his career progression. We appreciate the MADD organization's recognition of Officer Buzzard's achievements.



STREET DEPARTMENT

On July 16th, 2004, the Street department hosted an ADOSH compliant training session for Fall protection and Fall Arrest Safety. Members in attendance included Streets, Parks, Water and Fire Departments for a total of 31 trainees. The Training included 3 hours in the classroom and then an hour outside for actual hands-on harness check and awareness training while using a bucket truck by certified operators to enhance the lesson. The training went vey well and staff in attendance appreciated the trainer's expertise and thoughtful approach to make the training interactive and interesting.



Ray's journey with the town is a testament to his dedication and exceptional work ethic. He started humbly as a Laborer I with the Parks and Recreation Department and quickly advanced to Laborer II within a year, showcasing his commitment and competence.

On October 20, 1986, Ray transferred to Community Development as a Building Inspector, marking the beginning of his profound influence in the building field. His wealth of knowledge and expertise in this area became evident as he seamlessly navigated the complexities of building regulations and standards. His insights and guidance have been invaluable, earning him respect and admiration from colleagues and the community alike.
