

WATER DEPARTMENT

On February 11, 2024, aka “Super Bowl Sunday”, the Water Department was hard at work repairing two separate watermain breaks; one in Chaparral Pines and one in the Alpine Heights subdivisions. This strange circumstance led the Water Department to do a thorough post-incident evaluation to determine why two seemingly unrelated watermain leaks happened at the same time. The watermain in Chaparral Pines had been constructed in a manner that caused a large granite rock to pierce the wall of the pipeline causing a rupture. Unfortunately, this is not an altogether uncommon situation. However, the leak in Alpine Heights appeared to be a result of high pressures and soft soil conditions. So, that led our Field Supervisor, Mark Keeney, to further evaluate how a high pressure event could happen during a situation where pressures should have been reduced due the leak in Chaparral Pines. His evaluation led him to the Hillcrest Booster station, that was originally constructed in 1980, that some have affectionately referred to as our “Rube Goldberg Machine” because it seemed overly complicated but somehow magically functioned.

Mark’s review of the Hillcrest Booster station revealed an unknown check valve that had been buried on the outlet of the Hillcrest Tank in 1980. Because the valve was buried, nobody in the Water Department was aware of its existence. The buried check valve prevented filling of the tank and caused over pressurizing of the distribution system during the Chaparral Pines break which then triggered the Alpine Heights leak. The discovery further explained why the Hillcrest Booster Station was so complicated and why so many valves and pipes installed to reroute flows. So, a plan was formed to remove that check valve and greatly simplify the Alpine Heights Booster Station.



According to Wikipedia, **Rube Goldberg**, was an American cartoonist, sculptor, author, engineer, and inventor known for his popular cartoons depicting complicated gadgets performing simple tasks in indirect, convoluted ways. An example of a Rube Goldberg machine is as shown below:



In the first week of August, the materials and plans were finalized and Water Department staff notified first responders, customers, the Alpine Heights HOA, and the public that there would be a necessary temporary service interruption on Tuesday, August 6, 2024 between 9:00 AM and 1:30 PM to complete the work.

We're happy to report that we were able to complete the work successfully an hour ahead of schedule despite some setbacks on August 6, 2024. The check valve removal now allows the distribution system to safely release over pressurization into the Hillcrest Storage Tank and the booster station improvements will increase daily operating efficiencies and increases fire flow availability in the Alpine Heights subdivision.

We are truly fortunate to have BJ in our Parks and Recreation family and look forward to many more seasons of his leadership and dedication.



Back to School Begins!
Payson went back to school on July 29th. Kids from all over northern Gila County began their back to school startup. We would like to thank all the teachers, bus drivers, officer staff, and so many more who were instrumental in getting this year kicked off to a safe start.

Officers from various shifts made an effort to visit various schools this week to be a presence and help keep our students safe. Officers were happy to visit and take photos with all the kids while they were waiting to enter school first thing Monday morning. We also want to remind all the drivers to slow for the school zones and stop for the buses. Help us keep the kids of our community safe this school year.



STREET DIVISION

The Street crews have been busy for the last month with Monsoon storm cleanup, repairs and pre-rodeo preparations along the main collectors used by the public during our summer season. In the last month we've had several asphalt projects, a variety of concrete projects and miles of ditch cleaning, street sweeping and weed trimming.

During a 4:30am installation job, the Street crews pour a new section of curb and gutter during a sidewalk repair a few weeks before school begins.



During the Summer, our crew is usually operating in overdrive. From concrete projects to asphalt, to weeds, ditches and sweeping; our crew is usually inundated with a laundry list of must-do's which supersede the constant influx or residential requests for other concerns or necessity projects. Often we are assisting Engineering in emergency monitoring of contractor work zones. We've also been busy assisting Parks and Rec with events such as 4th of July, and The Rodeo.

In advance of the upcoming August Rodeo, our crew trimmed weeds in all the main collector roads that are frequented by the touring public over the upcoming week.



STREET DIVISION

Street crews quickly attack the intersection of Granite Dells and 260 at 4:00am before traffic kicked in for the weekend. This intersection had to be redressed and closed by the Town as the project was handed over to the next phase of contractors.



A manhole on Bonita posed a serious traffic hazard after it collapsed. Streets placed an emergency temporary cover plate with a cold patch approach while we are waiting on replacement parts to arrive and a suitable time to replace this manhole.

PROGRESS REPORT FOR PAYSON ROADWAY PROJECTS AUGUST 9, 2024

GRANITE DELLS ROAD

PROJECT OBJECTIVE: IMPROVE EXISTING ROADWAY TO ALLOW FOR BETTER TRAFFIC CAPACITY AND FLOW, ENHANCE SAFETY AND REDUCE CONGESTION.

PROJECT SCOPE: GRANITE DELLS ROAD FROM ITS INTERSECTION WITH STATE ROUTE 260 ON THE WEST TO THE ROUNDABOUT AT MUD SPRINGS ROAD TO THE EAST. RECONSTRUCTION OF THE EXISTING ROADWAY WITH MINOR WIDENING AND IMPROVED PROFILE, STORM DRAIN UPGRADES AND EXPANSION, WATERLINE EXTENSIONS AND REPLACEMENT, AND MODIFICATION OF THE SAFEWAY CENTER DRIVEWAY ONTO GRANITE DELLS TO A RIGHT-IN-RIGHT-OUT ONLY CONFIGURATION.

CURRENT PHASE: CONSTRUCTION

CURRENT PROGRESS SUMMARY: THE CONTRACTOR HAS INITIATED DEMOLITION AND GRADING OPERATIONS. CLEARING VEGETATION AND REMOVAL OF ROOT BALLS ALONG THE ROW HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED. COMPLETED PULVERIZING EXISTING PAVEMENT AND STARTED GRADING THE BLENDED PULVERIZED AND NATIVE MATERIAL INTO FILL. STARTED TO EXCAVATE FOR RETAINING WALL FOOTING.

SINCE THE PROJECT HOTLINE HAS BEEN ACTIVATED, THERE HAVE BEEN 13 CALLS, PRIMARILY RELATED TO RIGHT-OF-WAY STAKES, FEW RELATED TO DETOUR/CLOSURE SIGNING AT BENTLEY AND BONITA AND EXTRA BARRICADES, SITE CLEARANCE FROM CUT TREES, AND STUMPS REMOVAL REQUESTS. CALLS HAVE BEEN RESPONDED TO WITH NECESSARY ACTIONS BEING TAKEN.

UPCOMING WORK: COMPLETE RETAINING WALL FOOTING EXCAVATION. FORM AND POUR RETAINING WALL FOOTING. COMPLETE MASS GRADING TO ESTABLISH NEW PROFILE AND SUBGRADE COMPACTION TO PREPARE FOR BASE MATERIAL PLACEMENT.

EXPECTED COMPLETION: DECEMBER 2024

ENGINEERING DIVISION

PAVEMENT PRESERVATION

PROJECT OBJECTIVE: PROVIDE ROAD MAINTENANCE AND RECONSTRUCTION EFFORTS TO IMPROVE AND PRESERVE EXISTING ROAD.

PROJECT SCOPE: THE PROJECT CONSISTS OF TWO PHASES OF IMPROVEMENTS. PHASE 1, COMPLETED IN NOVEMBER 2023, INCLUDED CRACK SEALING AND SLURRY SEALING AT MULTIPLE LOCATIONS ON A DOZEN DIFFERENT ROADWAYS. PHASE 2 INCLUDES RECONSTRUCTION OF SEGMENTS OF AIRPORT ROAD, MANZANITA DRIVE, BONITA STREET, AND FRONTIER STREET.

CURRENT PHASE: PRE-CONSTRUCTION

CURRENT PROGRESS SUMMARY: CONTRACT FOR CONSTRUCTION HAS BEEN APPROVED (EXCEPT FOR AIRPORT RD). SCHEDULE HAS A START DATE OF AUGUST 19TH AND AN APPROXIMATE 6-WEEK CONSTRUCTION PERIOD. CEI, THE TOWN'S PROJECT MANAGEMENT FIRM IS PREPARING FOR PRECONSTRUCTION MEETING. THE AIRPORT ROAD PROPOSAL HAS BEEN RECEIVED AND IS CURRENTLY UNDER REVIEW.

UPCOMING WORK: COMPLETE PRECONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES AND BEGIN CONSTRUCTION. EXPECTED COMPLETION: NOVEMBER 2024

BEELINE BUS ROUTE IMPROVEMENTS

PROJECT OBJECTIVE: RECONSTRUCT AND IMPROVE EXISTING ROADWAY TO MAINTAIN SUSTAINABILITY AND IMPROVEMENTS FOR BETTER TRAFFIC AND PEDESTRIAN FLOW.

PROJECT SCOPE: THE PROJECT CONSISTS OF TWO PHASES OF IMPROVEMENTS TO MAXIMIZE THE USE OF FEDERAL FUNDING. PHASE 1 CONSISTS OF SIDEWALK, RAMPS, BUS STOP PADS AND SHELTERS, AND PAVEMENT RECONSTRUCTION ON 5 DIFFERENT STREETS (COLCORD ROAD, MCCLANE ROAD, EASY STREET, SUMMIT STREET, AND PONDEROSA STREET). PHASE 2 INCLUDES ADDITIONAL ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS OUTSIDE THE FEDERAL FUND ELIGIBILITY LIMITS ON THOSE SAME ROADS.

CURRENT PHASE: PRE-CONSTRUCTION

CURRENT PROGRESS SUMMARY: PROJECT WAS ADVERTISED FOR BID. TOWN ISSUED RESPONSES TO QUESTIONS SUBMITTED BY POTENTIAL BIDDERS. BID OPENING DELAYED FROM 7/31 TO 8/7 IN RESPONSE TO POTENTIAL BIDDER REQUEST. BID HAS CLOSED AND IS NOW BEING EVALUATED.

UPCOMING WORK: EXPEDITED BID REVIEW, CONTRACT EXECUTION AND AWARD TO ACCOMMODATE FAST START.

EXPECTED COMPLETION: ESTIMATED COMPLETION TIME TO BE DETERMINED ONCE WORK IS AWARDED.

GENERAL PLAN 2024-2034

THE TOWN COUNCIL APPROVED THE GENERAL PLAN 2024-2034 ON JUNE 26, 2024. IT WILL BE UP FOR VOTER RATIFICATION IN THE NOVEMBER 2024 ELECTION. WHAT IS THE GENERAL PLAN 2024-2034?

THE GENERAL PLAN IS A POLICY DOCUMENT GUIDING THE TOWN'S FUTURE DECISIONS ON LAND USE, GROWTH, PUBLIC SERVICES, INFRASTRUCTURE, AND RESOURCE CONSERVATION. REQUIRED BY ARIZONA LAW, IT'S UPDATED EVERY 10 YEARS AND MUST BE APPROVED BY VOTERS. THE PLAN INCLUDES A COMMUNITY VISION, GUIDING PRINCIPLES, GOALS, STRATEGIES, AND FRAMEWORK PLANS TO DIRECT GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT OVER THE NEXT DECADE.

WHAT THE GENERAL PLAN 2024-2034 IS NOT.

THE PLAN DOES NOT CONTROL THE TOWN'S DAILY OPERATIONS, REZONE PROPERTY, RAISE TAXES, CREATE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICTS, OR IMPLEMENT DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS. SPECIFIC REGULATIONS ARE FOUND IN THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE AND OTHER SECTIONS OF THE TOWN CODE.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THE GENERAL PLAN 2024-2034?

THE PURPOSE OF THE PLAN IS TO ENSURE THAT DECISIONS ON GROWTH AND REDEVELOPMENT ISSUES MADE BY TOWN COUNCIL, TOWN STAFF MEMBERS, AND COMMISSIONS, ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE COMMUNITY'S VISION FOR THE FUTURE. THE PLAN IS MANDATED BY AND MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF ARIZONA REVISED STATUE §9-461.05 ET.SEQ.

HOW IS THE GENERAL PLAN 2024-2034 ORGANIZED?

THE PLAN IS ORGANIZED INTO AN EXECUTIVE SUMMARY AND ELEVEN SECTIONS, ENCOMPASSING EIGHT STATUTORY ELEMENTS:

3. VISIONING AND GUIDING PRINCIPLES: TOWN'S 10-YEAR VISION AND PURPOSE STATEMENTS BASED ON PUBLIC INPUT.
4. LAND USE ELEMENT: FUTURE LAND USE VISION, ISSUES, GOALS, AND STRATEGIES.
5. GROWTH AREA ELEMENT: VISION FOR GROWTH, KEY ISSUES, GOALS, STRATEGIES, AND IDENTIFIED GROWTH AREAS.
6. CIRCULATION ELEMENT: TRANSPORTATION VISION, ISSUES, GOALS, STRATEGIES, AND FUTURE IMPROVEMENTS.
7. COMMUNITY DESIGN ELEMENT: VISION FOR COMMUNITY DESIGN, KEY ISSUES, GOALS, STRATEGIES, AND VISUAL IDENTITY.
