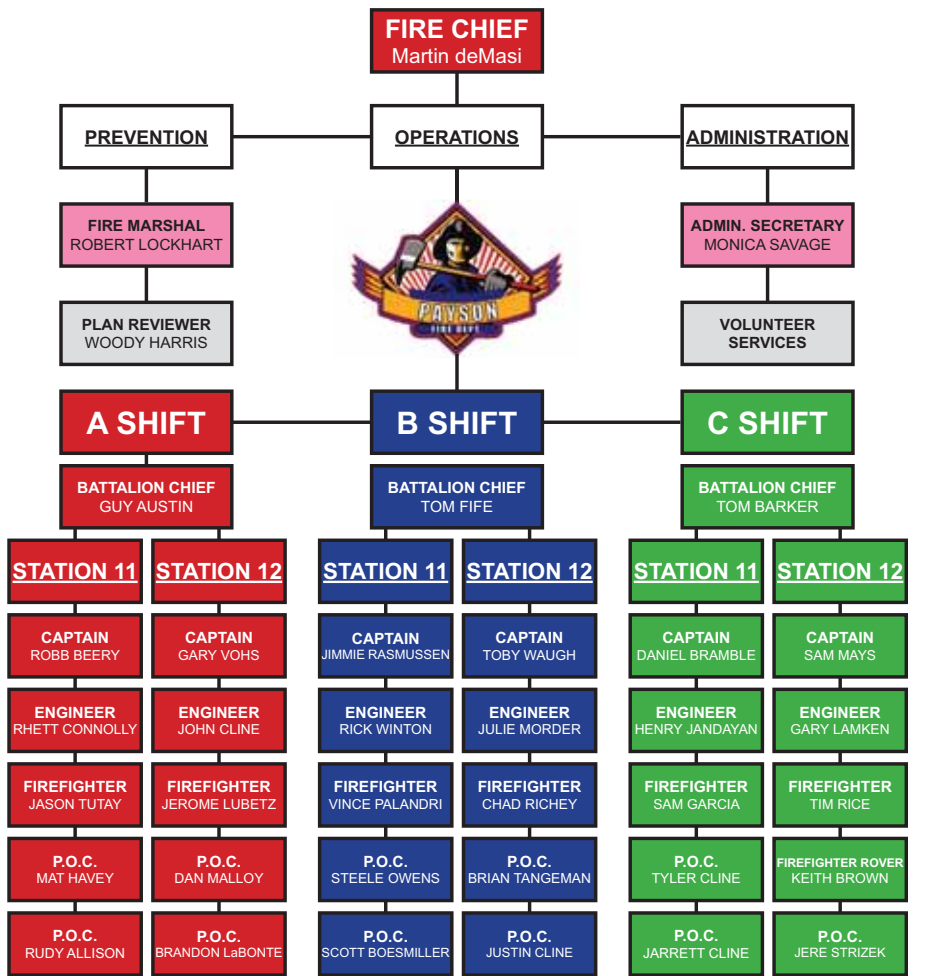


Payson Fire Department

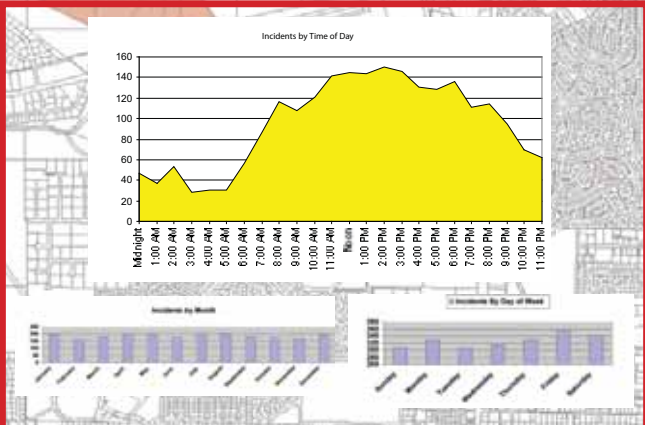
